MUNICIPAL ELECTION: Did you know that the Municipal Election on November 2nd is by mail ballot only? Regular polling places will NOT be open. If you did not receive your mail ballot and you believe you are registered, or still need to register to vote, please call the Cascade County Election Office to see about registering or to get a ballot at (406) 454-6803. You have until Monday, November 1st, at noon to be able to do late registration.

TWELVE TEEPEES ON THE HILL: You can see them from afar! Twelve teepees are set up (representing each tribe) and lit to recognize Native American Month at the Great Falls Public School Administration Building (1100 4th Street South). They will stay up until November 30th. Thanks to Indian Education Director Dugan Coburn and his crew for sharing the beauty and heritage with our entire community.

First Week: Multi-colored lights to represent the diversity among our twelve tribal nations.

Second Week: Red lights to recognize the Missing & Murdered Indigenous People Crisis.

Third Week: Multi-colored lights to represent the diversity among our twelve tribal nations.

Fourth Week: Orange lights ~ Every Child Matters: movement to recognize all Indigenous children of the boarding school experience especially those who did not come home

HIGHWAY CLEANUP: On Saturday, October 23rd, a small group gathered to do highway cleanup on the I-15 section just north of Cascade GFR adopted "In Memory of Stagecoach Mary." It was our third cleanup. We have picked up 37

huge bags of trash from the sides of the road. We may try to do one more cleanup event in November if the weather holds out.

BIG SKY COUNTRY NATIONAL HERITAGE AREA, INC IS ALIVE AND WELL:

The effort to create the first National Heritage Area (NHA) in Montana is moving forward. The final Feasibility Study will soon be submitted to the National Park Service and verify central Montana's national significance to America's heritage. Like other NHAs, Big Sky Country NHA will help bring together people who wish to honor our culture, share our unique history, and promote beautiful places *under the big sky*.

NHAs were first established under Ronald Reagan's presidency to allow local communities to determine how best to tell and preserve their history. It is puzzling why some have tried to politicize the Big Sky Country NHA effort when Mitch McConnell is currently spearheading an initiative to establish the first NHA in Kentucky. For goodness sakes, the entire state of Tennessee is an NHA!

NHAs have no legal authority and cannot influence local, state, or federal policies, laws, or regulations (i.e. zoning, planning, hunting/fishing, land use). Enabling legislation language in all newly established NHAs specifically forbids NHAs from impacting private property rights. Congress can remove NHA designation if violations occur, and a Government Accountability Office Report in 2004 reviewed all existing NHAs and found no evidence of impacts to private landowners. In truth, NHAs simply convene people who want to do a project together - no landowners are coerced into participating in a project. NHAs elsewhere have stimulated the economy and brought business to local communities.
