Kitchen volunteers start serving at 8:30 am. The shift is two hours, during which food is prepared and packaged into coolers. Volunteers need to be able to move around and stay on their feet for two hours. Drivers begin at 10:00 to 10:30 am and make deliveries along pre-planned routes. These volunteers will take the coolers to the homes and deliver meals to the residents. Volunteers also serve a brief wellness check for the residents, having a quick visit with them before moving on to the following location. CHILDREN'S RECEIVING HOME: The Great Falls Children's Receiving Home's annual gift wrap fundraiser is starting Monday, **December 11th** and will run through early afternoon of **December 24th**. Volunteers can sign up for available shifts to gift wrap at the link below. They will be at Kaufman's during the day and Mighty Mo in the evenings Mondays through Fridays, Saturdays at both places, and Sundays at Mighty Mo only.

Gift wrapper volunteers will sign up for two-hour shifts and will work with at least one other volunteer at all times. Volunteers must be able to wrap presents, but they will also learn some tricks from their fellow volunteers. The dress code is business casual, and volunteers should have good customer service skills. This annual event is their second-largest fundraiser of the year and helps the Receiving Home provide the services to protect local children.
