4TH OF JULY COMMUNITY CELEBRATIONS: The 4th of July holiday is fast approaching! There are several events taking place that the whole family can enjoy, including the annual 4th of July Parade, Eagle Falls Golf Course Community Party, a free downtown concert by Rodney Atkins, and the community fireworks display.

Don't miss the 4th of July Parade! On Thursday, **July 4th**, grab your lawn chair and find your favorite viewing spot along the parade route. The parade begins at **11:00 am** sharp, and the route runs from 1st Avenue South to 8th Street, north to Central Avenue, and then heads west to Park Drive and disbands in Margaret Park (north of the Civic Center). There are several <u>parking facilities</u> available within walking distance of the parade. For more information about the parade, contact Lola Galloway at (406) 750-4721.

The 4th of July Hootenanny, with live music, will begin immediately after the parade on Central Avenue 5th Street. For details, visit <u>Facebook</u>.

Cool off after the parade by sliding down the Power Tower Plunge, climbing the Kersplash Rock Wall, or hitting the riptide slide and chillin' in the Lazy River at the Electric City Water Park. There is fun for the entire family at the water park. The Electric City Water Park will be open from **12:00 pm** until **6:00 pm**.

Later in the evening, take the whole family to the People's Park & Recreation Foundation community fireworks display. The best viewing of the community fireworks display will be at Elk's-Riverside Park (River Drive North between Central & 6th Street) and will begin at around 10:15 pm (when it gets dark) from West Bank Park. West Bank Park will be closed all day for the pyrotechnics to set up the display. Parking is available at Gibson Park. Other firework viewing options include Eagle Falls Golf Course and Centene Stadium. The Great Falls Voyagers are also in town, and the game begins at 7:00 pm with fireworks to follow.

The golf course is hosting a free Community Celebration starting at **6:00 pm** with live music, games for kids, and food and drink specials in the Taphouse. For those who want to play golf, sign up for the nine-hole, two-person scramble beginning at **5:00 pm**. For more information, call Eagle Falls at (406) 761-1078.

As a reminder, leave your fireworks at home. As in previous years, fireworks may not be discharged in any city park or on any public sidewalk, Street, public right-of-way, public easement, or alley. They should only be discharged on private

property such as the sidewalk leading to a residence or driveway. If your family plans on discharging fireworks within the City limits this year, make sure you are in the know about the City's Fireworks Ordinance and understand the <u>basic rules and regulations pertaining to fireworks</u>. The discharging of fireworks within the City limits can only take place on **July 2nd**, **3rd**, and **4th** from **8:00 am** to **midnight**. Have a Happy and Safe 4th of July.

GREAT FALLS FARMERS MARKET: The Great Falls Farmers' Market is a non-profit organization with the mission of "Growing Commerce Through Community." The market is open every **Saturday** from **8:30 am to 1:00 pm** from the first Saturday of June through the last Saturday of September.
