IMPORTANT VOTING DEADLINES

- October 7th: Deadline for regular voter registration.
- October 7th: Deadline for postmark if you're mailing in your registration form. It must be received at the election office by October 10th.
- October 7th: Early voting begins.
- October 11th: Absentee ballots begin to be sent out.
- October 18th: Recommended deadline for requesting a mail-in ballot.
- October 28th: Recommended deadline for returning your ballot so that it reaches the local election office in time.
- November 5th: Election Day. All ballots must be received by 8:00 pm for them to count.

Check your voter registration status. Things to consider:

- Is your voting address correct?
- Is your voter status "active"?
- If you travel or are a snowbird, be sure your absentee mailing address is set to where you will be when the ballots are mailed on **October 11th**.
- Are your kids or grandkids away at college? Check with them to make sure their absentee mailing address is correct.

Check the Montana Secretary of State's <u>Voter Registration Page</u>. Late Voter Registration is available up to and including the day of election. Late Registration requires registration forms to be filed in the Election Office.
