**125th ANNUAL CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT:** Event by Giant Springs State Park, 4803 Giant Springs Road, on **Saturday, December 14th** at **8:00 am**. The annual Christmas Bird Count (CBC) is a census of not just the species seen but also the

numbers of birds seen on a single day within a set time frame. Great Falls has a 'count circle that is 15 miles in diameter. Teams of birders set out on the same day to cover the entire area to count all the birds they can find.

The CBC at Giant Springs State Park will be led by members of the Upper Missouri Breaks Audubon Society, and registered participants are to meet at the Giant Springs Ranger Station on December 14th at 8:00 AM. Participants can spend an hour or the entire morning with the counting crew. If you can't identify birds, you will learn some basics. If you can count, record numbers, or bird names you can also help. If you are just curious what kind of person goes out in the winter to see and count birds you can come too. Sometimes there are thousands of ducks, surprise vagrant ducks, or the river is frozen and there are almost no ducks. There are also songbirds to find. This will be outdoors, dress for the weather, bring your own drinking water, and be prepared to walk around the park. Binoculars will be available to borrow if needed. There is no age limit for this event, and participants under 12 should be accompanied by an adult.

That's where Larry's eyes were opened, the lights came on, and the words started to flow forth like a river. His work in healthcare, since graduating from the University of Montana in 1990, as a Physical Therapist with a focus on long-term care has given Larry a unique perspective on Health, Healing, Hope, Humor, Happy, Harmony, and Hallelujah, which are the first seven chapters in his book entitled Bird Food for Life.
